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Christmas In Antarctica: White Christmas Guaranteed

British Antarctic Survey (BAS) staff working on the frozen continent are preparing to celebrate the festive season in style. Nearly 300 researchers, engineers, crew and support staff, located across five research stations and on board the RRS Sir David Attenborough, are guaranteed a white Christmas

complete with snow, ice and penguins.

The festive period in Antarctica is often the busiest part of the field season, when station operations and science projects are in full swing. Some will celebrate with station and ship colleagues whilst others will be living under canvas in the 'deep field'.

Rothera Research Station, Adelaide Island, Antarctic Peninsula

At Rothera Research Station, December marks the busiest time of year. As the UK's largest research station, around 150 people will come together for Christmas movies, mince pie making and gingerbread decorating alongside the vital research and operations in the deep



field. For many people, it's work as normal. A meteorological balloon will be launched as usual, the marine divers will head into the bay to collect specimens and if the weather's good the pilots will fly to deploy or collect researchers and their teams from the deep field.

The Rothera team is bigger this year as additional construction staff work on the ambitious station modernisation, currently working on the new 100+ room Discovery Building, a facility to house all the operations functions. It is due for completion and handover in early 2025. Having decorated the station for the festive period, the team will also be running the annual Christmas Door Competition where wreaths are fashioned from recycled rubbish, and origami stars and penguins are made out of old paper. Most staff will try to take part of Christmas Day to relax. taking the time to enjoy a traditional

Christmas lunch with all the trimmings, as well as sports like football and rounders. With almost 24 hours of sunlight at this time of year in Antarctica, there's plenty of time to get involved with the festivities!

A number of staff will also be spending the season deployed out in the Antarctic wilderness, including the field stations Sky-Blu and Fossil Bluff, doing their science research and providing essential air operations and re-fuelling aircraft.

UK Tap Water Now a Health Risk

The safety of tap water in the UK could be at risk because water companies are unable to use products to clean it, industry insiders have said, as all the laboratories that test and certify the chemicals have shut down.

UK rules mean products cannot be tested abroad; they have to be tested in the country in a certified lab, of which there are now none.

If companies are unable to keep contaminants out of the water supply, it can cause a danger to health. This year, thousands of people in Devon became unwell after the cryptosporidium parasite was detected in the supply. Schools and businesses had to temporarily close and it negatively affected the local economy. Some households had to boil their tap water for a month to remove the contaminant.

Laboratories have to be regulation 31 certified, meaning they carry out all the tests on chemicals, pipes or other items to a certain standard. There used to be three such laboratories in the UK, but since 2021 there have been none as they all shut down because they are expensive to run.

This means new products cannot be tested or used to clean water, and that products that have to be retested every five years also cannot be approved. Whistleblowers at water companies have said this "limits the availability of products in the market which both risks safety and reduces competition, which will drive up prices and reduce service quality". There is a backlog of dozens of products awaiting testing.

More Trouble in the Water

Britain's biggest water supplier reports 40% increase in pollution incidents, blaming a wet spring and summer Thames Water has said it will run out of cash by next March if it fails to secure a £3bn financial lifeline, as it admitted its sewage spills had risen sharply. Britain's biggest water supplier said on Tuesday that all of its funds may be "exhausted" if it failed to secure the emergency funding from its creditors, putting it at risk of temporary nationalisation. The heavily indebted company recorded a 40% increase in the number of pollution incidents in the six months to 30 September. Thames reported 359 category one to three pollution incidents in that period, blaming an especially wet spring and summer.

The industry has faced public outcry over sewage spills into seas and waterways. The Thames Water chief executive, Chris Weston, said that after "record rainfall and groundwater levels in our region, pollution and spills are unfortunately up".

Thames faces two critical court dates, on 17 December and 20 January, in order to secure approval for the money – referred to as a "liquidity extension" – which some creditors have already agreed to lend.

Dog Trained to Sniff Out UK Tree Disease

Sniffer dogs are usually found looking for contraband at airports and train stations, but the UK government is now dispatching trained hounds to find forest-harming pests.

A dog has been used for the first time in the UK to successfully identify tree disease. Researchers from Forest Research used a trained spanador – a cocker spaniel labrador cross – to find the tree pathogen Phytophthora ramorum.

Six-year-old Ivor the dog achieved a 89% successful first-time detection rate of the pest. This is an important finding as the disease is a menace to UK forests; spread

by rain, the fungal-like organism causes the death of a wide range of trees and shrubs and has led to thousands of hectares of felling around the UK.

Dr Heather Dun, a pathologist at Forest Research, said: "The results from the trials have been incredibly encouraging, with a first-time 89% detection rate highlighting the huge potential of dogs in our fight against pests and diseases." "Biosecurity is incredibly important and detection dogs like Ivor are an exciting new method for helping to protect our trees."

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Optometry optimised in eye-opening new service

A complaint that has been made in the past often went along these lines, "The Directorate should conduct customer satisfaction surveys to get people's opinion on what services they're happy with and what needs improving. What about the Optician's service, as allegedly a huge proportion of the public are not happy with that service." That is a quote from a letter to the Independent published a few years ago. It often seemed to be the departure of the optician was formally announced but the arrival and how to book an appointment was not. Things are now starting to change.

Spectacle Warehouse is a well-established optometry business in South Africa. They have branches in Cape Town, Pretoria, Weltevreden and Claremont. They also have a large reputation, having won an award for two years running.

Another advantage of the new service is that prescribed spectacles should be ready for collection by the patient in about 2 to 3 weeks after the final appointment.

The appointment of Spectacle Warehouse for eye care services follows a developing trend where South African medical specialists are contracted by our Health Service because they are often quicker, cheaper, and at least as good as similar services obtained from the UK. The never-ending recruitment problem does not arise when medical care contracts can be organised in this way.

Optometrist Stephnie van Dyke arrived here on 30th November with colleagues from Spectacle Warehouse. Their purpose was an investigatory first visit for offering eye care in St Helena. They were here until Tuesday this week finding out how best to set up their 'travelling' service and at the same time worked through 100 consultations. It is a travelling service because all the specialist apparatus was brought in for the visit. Readers who have had their eyes tested overseas will have recognised some advanced testing equipment and smaller, hand-held tools. There was also a wide range of frames to choose from.

One part of the outpatients' clinic was devoted to eye care tests and diagnosis. There were about four testing areas with three optometrists working on what appeared to be different specialist examinations. There was around six people being attended to at the same time but in different testing areas by the specialists. No one seemed to wait too long to be called for treatment. An eye surgeon was also available if required.

The next visit is planned for March 2025. Unusually, that is three months' notice for an appointment. Having completed the investigatory/organisational work during the first visit, it is expected that up to 200 patients requiring eye care will be accommodated during future visits. The intention is to have four visits a year though a contract with Spectacle Warehouse. The contract details are not yet finalised.

Pace Quickens for Overseas Medical Referrals

The backlog in overseas medical referrals was a negotiating point when the St Helena, UK and possibly the Mauritian governments discussed the Chagos Islands migrant deal. An announcement last week said the first group of medical referrals are already in South Africa for much needed treatment. It is said that about 50 patients requiring critical overseas medical treatment will be cleared from the list of people awaiting treatment overseas.

An ongoing plan is being worked on to co-ordinate the various treatments required. Individual cases are being prioritised according to urgency of treatment, access to specialist treatment and other necessary resources. It is anticipated that over the next 9 to 12 months all patients identified for treatment from this special, one-off funding will have been referred overseas for specialist treatment.

At the same time, opportunities to increase the range of specialist treatment available on-Island continues. Recently there have been successful joint replacement surgeries and a urology specialist visited St Helena a few weeks ago. If the range of on-Island specialist treatment can be increased it will avoid some of the requirement for overseas medical referrals and the higher costs associated with them.

Malaria Victims - Some Good News

We all know that two unlucky members of the St Helena cricket team returned from Nigeria showing symptoms of malaria. The disease carried by malarial mosquitoes appears not to have affected any other team members who were tested for malaria the day after returning to St Helena. The two who showed symptoms were sent straight to hospital after arriving last Saturday.

Meaningful information from the Castle is non-existent. A cloak of secrecy surrounds the two malaria victims on the grounds of 'confidentiality' in cases of any individual's medical history or current condition. However, the widespread public discussion on these two cases makes any attempt at secrecy in order to protect the identities of the people concerned ineffective.

Our sympathy goes out to the two victims of this disease and their families. Malaria has unpleasant symptoms which include fever (this is the most common symptom), chills, headache, sweats, fatigue, nausea and vomiting, body aches and generally feeling sick. Treatment for malaria

usually involves prescription drugs that kill the parasite causing the disease. There are different parasites causing different types of malaria and the right drug needs to be used to kill the parasite in question. Also, there are some parasites which have become resistant to some of the drugs used.

The Independent has learned that the malaria disease is now under control and the two victims have been discharged from hospital. However, while other members of the cricket team and the officials have been tested it is not impossible that further cases may come to light as the incubation period is very variable.

People are reminded only those who have recently

travelled to malaria-endemic areas can be affected; the infection cannot be spread on the island as there are no mosquitoes here of the type that can carry malaria.

In South Africa, the high-risk area for malaria is on the borders with Zimbabwe and Mozambique. The rest of South Africa is low to no risk.

Apart from malaria, there are five other common diseases carried by mosquitoes which affect communities in Africa. They are; chikungunya, dengue, West Nile, yellow fever and Zika viruses. For other countries in Africa, it is best to obtain information from a reliable online website on the risk of any mosquito-borne virus.

Attorney General Resigns

The Attorney General, David Ballantyne, announced his resignation at last Friday's Legislative Council. He told ministers, councillors and officers that upholding the position of attorney general had become 'progressively untenable' and that the role was 'unsustainable'. He gave no further explanation for these comments. While not giving the date when he will retire, he did say he expected the Legco on 6th December to be his last.

Mr Ballantyne was appointed on 3rd May 2023 for a period of two years. It seems he will be resigning about four months early.

Attorney generals have retained the position for shorter periods than previously. The longest service attorney general was Ken Baddon who

held the post for eight years. Before him, David Jeremiah was in post for six years and before that, Alan Hoole for five years. Since Ken Baddon's departure, most attorney generals have held the job for two years or less. Their time in office being interspersed with acting attorney general's.

Finding a new recruit for the job of attorney general, St Helena, is never easy. A scramble can be foreseen to find a suitable person before David Ballantyne heads off to the airport for the last time. It may be that an acting attorney general is appointed. None of this disruption can be seen as helping to improve the stability and efficiency of the Attorney General's Chambers.

Mr Ballantyne's farewell speech did contain some good news. After two years without a commercial lawyer in the attorney general's chambers, there will soon be two. One commercial lawyer is already in place, a second will join the chambers in February. The February arrival is described as having an impressive career record. He has experience of working in rural environments and looks upon his appointment in St Helena as 'an opportunity of a lifetime'. The new recruit, like Mr Ballantyne, is a fellow Scot. The retiring attorney general set great store in having not one, but two, commercial lawyers on the chamber's team.

Mr Ballantyne also announced what appears to be the beginnings of a long-awaited legislative

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programme. A long list of proposed legislation was considered by Executive Council where a decision had to be made on which of those on the list would have priority.

- 1. Legislation on cyber crime was the first to be mentioned as important.
- 2. Next was updating sexual offences legislation to make it fit for the 21st century
- 3. Amendment to the Road Traffic Ordnance was considered urgent so that the permissible level of alcohol when driving a vehicle could be reduced.
- 4. Vetting drivers of public service vehicles was next, together with updated PSV vehicle regulations.
- 5. Merchant Shipping legislation is also urgent; compliance with international regulations is now pressing.
- 6. Also considered urgent is capping costs of litigation. Comparisons with UK costs is not considered realistic. Costs matching St Helena's Public Solicitors' Office is thought more appropriate.
- 7. Next and last on the priority list is formalising the duty of care in our Health Service. The ever-present limits on health budgets and recruitment of healthcare professionals need to be recognised and reflected in either policy or legislation when defining limits on the duty of care.

No doubt some of the seven priorities for Bills presented to Legislative Council will be the subject of public debate.

Darren McLean Has Been There and Done That - Almost

Australian, Darren McLean flew out on Tuesday after spending a week in St Helena. He's coming to the end of his mission to visit the world's 251 countries and territories. Darren McLean's website, taste2travel.com, tells us he has visited 242 of the 251 destinations. Since his last website update, he has visited the Falkands and St Helena, so there is more updating to be done. That leaves seven to go. Of these, four are in Africa – Sudan, Central African Republic, Republic of the Congo and Liberia. These countries can suffer civil unrest or civil war so they are being left until quieter times prevail. Ascension and Tristan da Cunha are also to be visited. That leaves one more. Perhaps he will tell us on his website which one that is.

What will Darren do when he has crossed the last county or territory off his list? That is a decision still to be made. The beaches in Thailand are great, he says. He has been travelling around for several years. He has no home, he sold that. He has no job; he gave up working for a living. He says he decided to get his money working for him instead of him working for money. As a consultant in technowizardry, he says he was very much overpaid and saved a lot if it. After studying finance, he decided to invest in shares. The dividends from shares keep him on the road, the planes, the ships and rented cars – and in hotels.

Travelling all the time does not put anyone beyond the reach of tiresome regulations. The pages in his Australian passport are almost all used up. The South African immigration officials told him he needed more unused pages to make his passport valid. Section 2 (1) (d) of the South African Immigration

Regulations say that everyone needs at least two unused pages 'when presented for purposes of endorsing a port of entry visa, visa, permanent residence permit or entry or departure stamp'. Darren McLean has less than two pages but somehow managed to get out of South Africa to come here. No doubt the same discussions and negotiations will be repeated now he has flown back to South Africa.

The real bitch in all of this is The Australian passport that Darren needs costs £200. They don't issue a bumper 64-page passport anymore, just the 32-page passport. If the pages get filled up with visa, arrival and a departure stamps, Australians have to re-apply for another passport. The passport will only be valid to the same date as passport that has all the pages (except the last two) filled up but will cost a further £125. For this reason, Darren has to fly from Jo'burg to Paris to join the other Aussies in the queue who are enquiring about re-issued passports. I'm sure Darren will head off to the beaches of Thailand soon after that, stay put in one place and catch up with the friends he has there.

What did Darren think of St Helena? He was amazed at the changes in the weather, not just according to the time of day, also how the weather changes according to what side of a ridge you might be on. Also noted was the varied vegetation alongside the local weather variances. He climbed Jacob's Ladder and was fascinated by the red billed tropic bird and their chicks on the cliffs. But he thought Jamestown looked 'run-down'. "Is there a lack of civic pride", he asked. "No", was the reply, "but a lack of money, as well as political commitment to conserving historic structures and promoting strategically planned development as the foundation of economic development."

The Ministerial System and Governance – How We Doing?

The new ministerial system is now in it's final year before the next general election is due. Has the new system improved the way government does its job? Is there more transparency in decision-making? Does everyone involved know what their role in



government is? Are people happy with the way things are going?

Legislative Council decided to commission a review of governance and the ministerial system; the reviewers are now coming to the end of their two weeks on the Island. They have been very busy talking to all kinds of people in face-to-face or group meetings and there was a public meeting at Half Tree Hollow Community Centre on Wednesday. A general summary of the feedback from the public meeting is that the ministerial system is developing more or less OK, but there is still more development needed. On wider governance issues, some issues raised were in the 'could do better' category.

The Review Panel consists of Dr Ronan Cormacain, Mr Steven Tweedie and Lord Robert Lisvane. They are working with the Westminster Foundation for Democracy, a highly respected institution who describe their work as helping to make countries' political systems fairer, more inclusive, and more accountable. They do this by working with parliaments, political parties, electoral bodies and civil society. They operate directly in more than 30 countries and territories across the world. Themes the Westminster Foundation are actively working on include accountability and transparency, elections, participation and openness, inclusion, environmental democracy, and women's political leadership.

In St Helena the spotlight is on the structure of government, the ministerial system and the division of responsibilities between the different branches of government. This includes the Governor, Executive Council, Legislative Council, and the Public Service. The working relationship between SHG and the UK Government must also, inevitably, be included in the mix.


The structure of our government gets unavoidably complicated because it is not only SHG that is involved. The UK Government has a significant say in high-level decisions if only because so much of total government spending is paid for by the UK. The position of Governor can be a bit quirky too. Sometimes the Governor must feel a bit like 'piggy-in-the-middle', with St Helena ministers, councillors and senior government officers taking up positions on a hot topic and the UK Government sometimes watching closely how a hot topic develops.

The St Helena structure always has more than one decision-making institution able to influence decisions and this will not change in our lifetimes. This situation makes openness and transparency a bigger challenge for those who genuinely want to see more of it. This situation also provides a convenient excuse for secrecy and opacity for those who do not.

A report will be published early in the new year by the Westminster Foundation reviewers on their findings while here for the last two weeks.

PRESS RELEASE Electricity Standing Charge on Empty Properties

Connect Saint Helena Ltd would like to make customers aware that the Utilities Regulatory Authority has approved that an electricity standing charge will apply to empty properties with effect from 1 December 2024.

This standing charge will not affect the majority of our existing customers, where the costs of electricity services are recovered through a unit rate. This new charge is intended to target those properties that stand empty for the majority of the quarter, often due to the occupants residing overseas. Whilst the property might be empty, Connect does incur fixed costs through the property remaining connected to the electricity grid. The electricity standing charge on empty properties is a means to recover these costs.

An empty property is defined as one that consumes less than 10 units of electricity in the quarter under review. The following standing charges will apply:

Consumer Type	Quarterly Standing Charge on Empty Properties
Domestic	£45
Commercial	£60
Government	£60

Connect appreciates that some empty properties may wish to disconnect from the electricity grid rather than incur the standing charge. The relevant charges that apply are as follows:

Service	Once-off Charge	
Disconnection	£45	
Reconnection within 6 months after a voluntary disconnection	£90	
Reconnection from 6 months after a voluntary disconnection	£200	

Connect appreciates that there may be practical reasons why a property might use less than 10 units per quarter. Connect is therefore willing to consider specific circumstances under which an exemption to the empty property standing charge might apply. For example, the empty property standing charge need not apply to properties under construction but will take effect from the point that occupancy has been approved. Similarly, if the property has low electricity usage due to unforeseen exceptional circumstances (for example, if the occupants are absent on medical grounds) an exemption may also apply. Customers who believe these circumstances apply should contact Connect.

The first bills to include the electricity standing charge on empty properties will be issued in January 2025.
